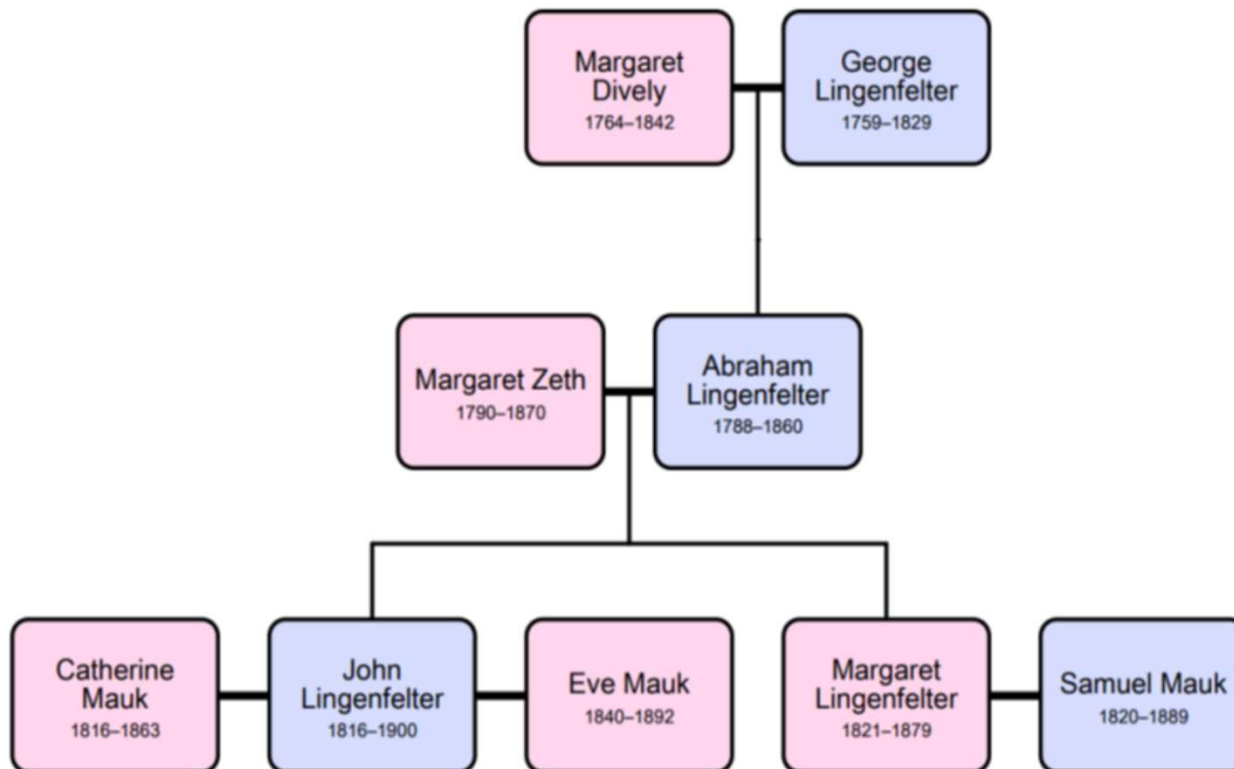

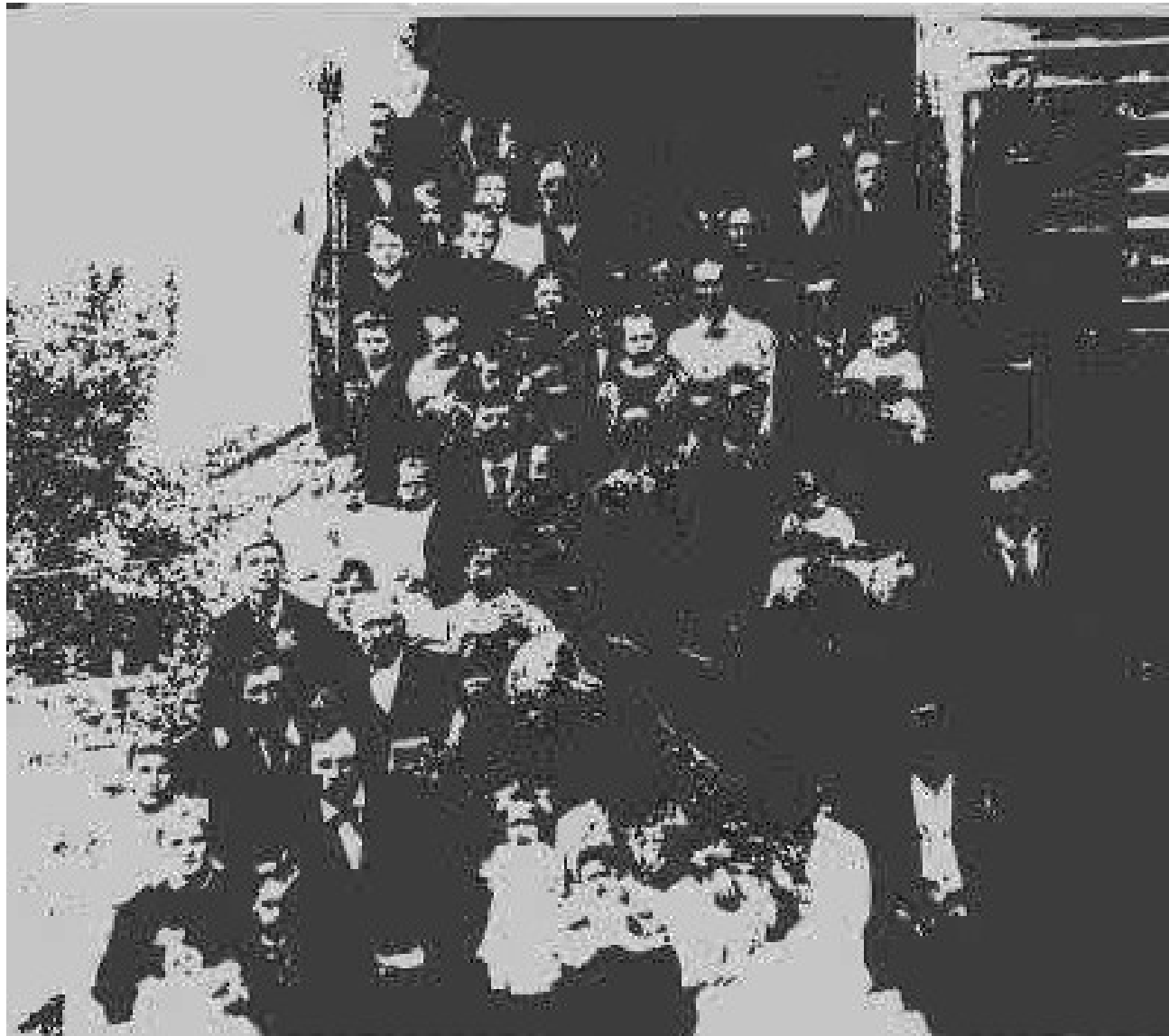

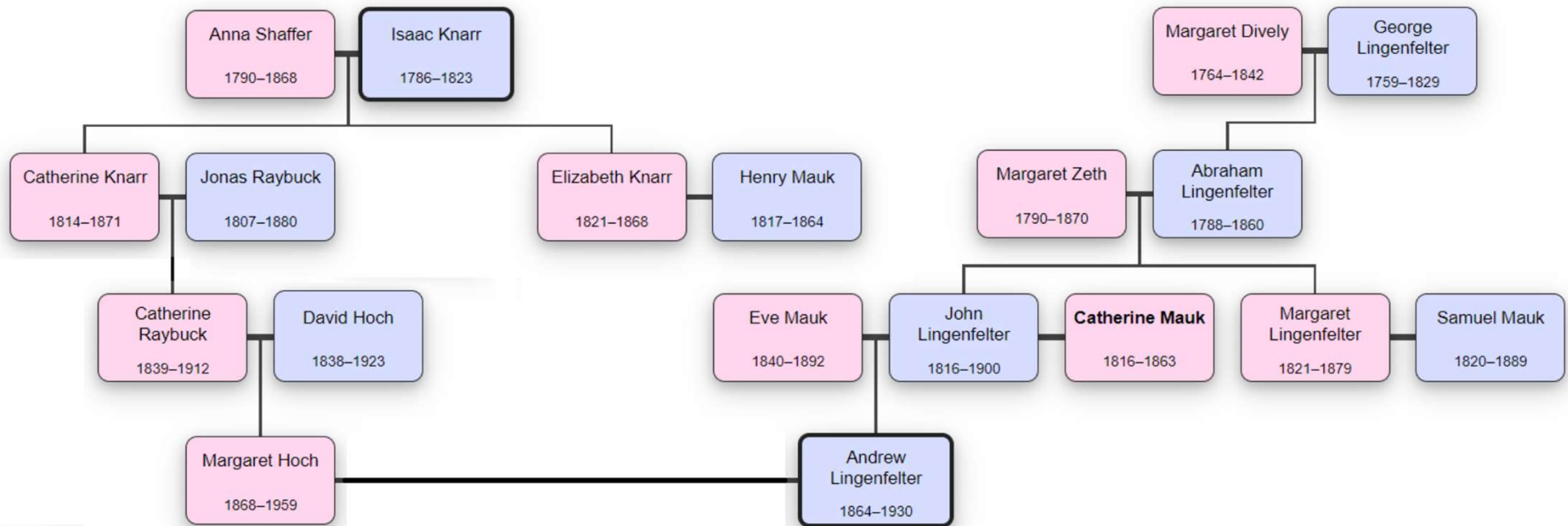
Mauk Family Reunion.

A reunion of the Mauk family was held at the old homestead of the late Isaac Mauk in Oliver township, Jefferson county, Pa., on Tuesday, August 31, 1897. Those present included children grand-children, great-grand-children, and friends, to the number of about eighty. About the first thing on the program after all had assembled was the photographing of the entire group, with the old homestead in the background, by Photographer Frampton of Punxs'y, after which all busied themselves in eating dinner, which was sumptuously and lavishly spread and heartily eaten. Among those present were two of the oldest ladies in Jefferson county, Mrs. Miller and Mrs. Lang. Jacob Mauk, the only son now living of the old original Mauk family, was also able to be present, he being 72 years old. Mrs. Mauk, Isaac's widow, who still resides on the farm, is also 72 years of age and had the pleasure of once more meeting all her children, with the exception of her son Isaac, who lives at Sheboygan, Mich. B. F. Mauk, the oldest son of the family, had just returned from Oklahoma and was there to mingle with the happy host. The day was spent in pleasant talks of childhood days now past and gone. It was a meeting long to be remembered, and will ever be cherished as a bright spot in the memory of every one there.

Wesley Enterline Shot His Step-father, **George Geist**, Friday Morning.

Last Friday morning Wesley Enterline, aged 24 years, deliberately shot his step-father, **George Geist**, in the abdomen with a shot gun, which resulted in the death of Mr. **Geist** Friday evening. The shooting occurred at Cool Spring, Jefferson county. Two Punxsutawney doctors were summoned and they moved Mr. **Geist** immediately to Dr. Grube's hospital in Punxsutawney and at 6.00 p. m. the old man died. **Geist** was 63 years old. It is claimed that Enterline is demented at times and that the crime was committed during one of his spells of temporary insanity. After shooting his step-father Enterline shouldered the shot gun and went to the woods, but in a short time he returned to a neighbor's house and gave himself up. He was taken to Brookville jail and has since been moved to the insane department at the county home.

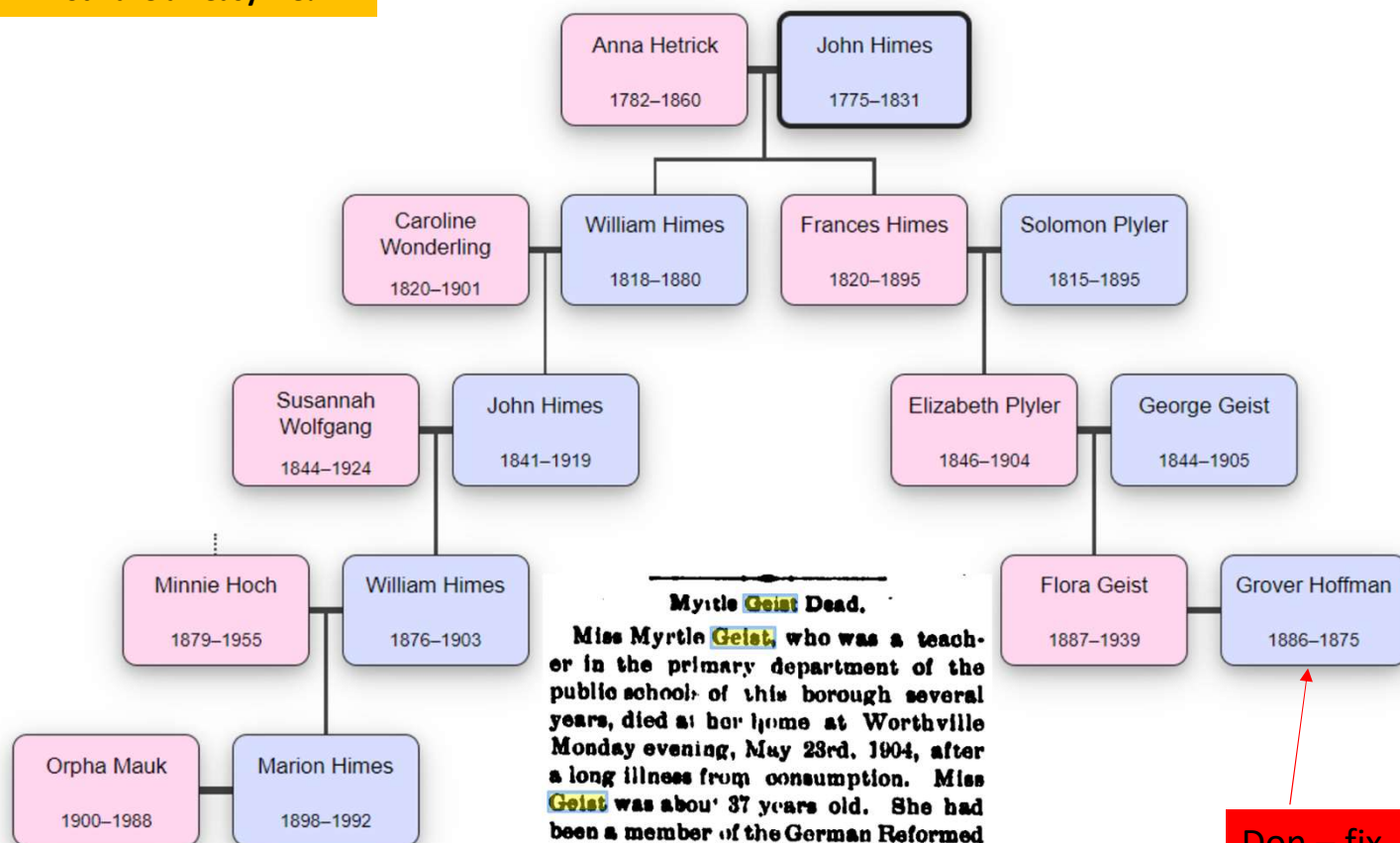
A Sad Accidentt.

Miss Myrtle **Geist**, who was a teacher in the primary department of the public school of this borough several years, died at her home at Worthville Monday evening, May 23rd, 1904, after a long illness from consumption. Miss **Geist** was about 37 years old. She had been a member of the German Reformed church a number of years. She was a highly esteemed young lady and a very successful teacher. Funeral service will be held this forenoon and interment will be made at Worthville.
