


The parents and grandparents of Jacob & Susannah are not known with any certainty. Some hypotheses are summarized on the previous page.

Jacob & Susannah are on WikiTree (on the right), which is a single collaborative tree like those on Family Search and Geni.com.

Susannah's ID on WikiTree is <u>Walters-</u> <u>4224</u>. Jacob's ID is <u>Mauk-137</u> and also Mock-693.



Tobias Mauk (b. July 22,1722) would have been about 70 years old when Jacob was born. Possible but not probable. No records of a Tobias Mauk/Mock have been found in Bedford County in the 18th century. There was a Tobias in Berks county and one in Bucks county, but it's very doubtful either was Jacob's father.



The record above is from the Oley Hill Church, Berks County, and shows the birth and baptism of a daughter of Tobias & Barbara Mauck in 1752. There are church records for three other children, the last born in 1760. There is also a Tobias in tax records for Colebrookdale, Berks County from 1779-1789.



The 1816 tax record, above, for Tobias Mock is from Richland, Bucks County. PA. A Tobias was also taxed in Milford, Bucks County in 1802. No other information could be found about this Tobias.

The 1830 US census for Greenfield Twp., Bedford County, PA (above) lists Jacob's family of 12. The ages are consistent with what we know of the family at the time: Jacob (age 38), Henry (12), John (11), Samuel (9), Joseph (5), Jacob Blaine (3), Susannah (32), Catherine (14), Sarah (11), Mary (7) and Elizabeth (2).



The 1820 US census for St. Clair Twp., Bedford County, PA is where Jacob's family of 6 is found. The numbers left to right mean: 2 males under 10 (Henry and John), 1 male 26-44 (Jacob), 2 females under 10 (Catherine and Sarah), 1 female 16-25 (Susannah) and 1 person "engaged in Agriculture" (Jacob).

Before 1820 we can only infer Jacob's and Susannah's presence in the 1800 and 1810 censuses. The best assumption is they were counted with their parent's household. Jacob (see later page) would have been 8 and 18 in these censuses. The problem is there is no consensus regarding his parents. Susannah (see below this page) would have been 2 and 12 and there is general agreement her parents were Henry Walter(s) and Mary Howe.

The 1800 US census for Hopewell and Woodberry, Bedford County, PA lists Henry Walters's family of 5. The numbers from left to right mean: 1 male under 10 (David, age 5), 1 male 26-44 (Henry, age about 26-29), 2 females under 10 (Barbara, 4 and Susannah, 2) and 1 female 16-25 (Mary, age 25). An 1850 census lists Mary Walter, age 76, which is consistent the 1800 census.

I cannot find Henry in the 1810 census. Most trees online say Henry died in 1806. This is incorrect as his 1835 will and census records from 1820 and 1830 show (see next page). The same trees say Henry was born in 1760. The census records indicate otherwise. According to the 1800 census, Henry was born between 1755 and 1775. In the1820 census he is 45+ and so born before 1776. In 1830 he was 50-59 giving birth years between 1770 and 1781. Combining these figures, Henry must have been born between 1770 and 1775.

Fred D. Ickes (1923-2009) was a descendant of Peter Mock (1742-1817) through Peter's son, Jacob Mock (1774-1853). He wrote books that detailed the descendants of Peter Mock (1742-1817) and Jacob Mock (d.1792). The images on this page are from the latter. Fred claimed Peter and Jacob were brothers but did not list any sources for his information.







The 1800 US census for Bedford and St. Clair lists 8 Mock families on the same page (above). Jacob would have been 8 years old and could be one of those counted in the orange circles. The first two orange families are the sons of Jacob (d.1792). Peter Jr. is the son of Peter (1742-1817) and the last Jacob is a mystery.

John and Peter Jr. haven't been found in the 1810 census but there are three Jacobs (above). #127 is the son of Jacob (d.1792), #152 is unknown but may be the mystery Jacob from 1800, and #163 is the red circled Jacob in 1800, he was the son of Peter (1742-1817) and the ancestor of Fred Ickes.


Catharina GARN married **Peter MOCK**, **Jr.** (son of **Peter MOCK**, **Sr.** and **Elizabeth**). Peter MOCK, Jr. was born in 1766. He died on 20 May 1826. The Peter Mock Genealogy reports that

The 1830 petition (below) lists Peter's & Catherine's children. The list matches the list in *The Garn Family* (right). Jacob isn't listed, so Peter & Catherine weren't Jacob's parents.


The Jacob Mock (1773-1853) on Family Search (above left) was the son of Peter Mock (1742-1817). Peter left his son Jacob's portion to Jacob's children who are listed in Peter's will (above right). There is no Jacob included in the list, so Jacob (1773-1853) and Catherine Barbara Berkheimer were not 'our' Jacob's parents.



Ickes has 'our' Jacob as the son of Jacob who was the son of Jacob (d.1792). This hypothesis can't be ruled out, but the mystery Jacob of 1800 / Jacob 3rd of 1810 could instead be the son of Jacob who was the son of Jacob (d.1792).



John Mock, son of Jacob Mock (d. 1792) is shown on Family Search (above) and WikiTree (right). The only source of information here is from his burial.





Regarding John's children (left) there are no sources for Jacob (right), Maria or Dorothy. John married Susannah Donner and their branch is known. George is really the son of Jacob Mock & Catherine Barbara Berkheimer.



In the 1820 census 'our' Jacob is noted "of John" to distinguish him from another Jacob "of Paul" who was the son of Paul Mock. A reasonable conclusion is 'our' Jacob's father was named John. 'Our' Jacob's 1st sons were named Henry and John, possibly after their grandfathers. If, however, John (b. 1761) actually had a son Jacob (b.1800) that would mean John was not 'our' Jacob's father.
